



## isi - Institut für Systemische Impulse – NVR activities 2018

In Switzerland, the isi, institut für systemische impulse (<a href="http://www.systemische-impulse.ch">http://www.systemische-impulse.ch</a>) and the expert network isi-netz24 (<a href="http://isi-netz24.ch">http://isi-netz24.ch</a>) continue to lead and disseminate NVR & NA, mainly in schools and social institutions. In the German speaking part of Switzerland NA has become an important reference for a value-based and relationship-oriented pedagogical approach. A big part of the most schools and institutions have heard of or even implemented NA. Many schools include NA in their long-term school development work and involve parents on their way. Two basic NVR trainings with Idan Amiel, Uri Weinblatt and Claudia Seefeldt took place in Zurich, a parent coaching training is offered by the institut in cooperation with the university of applied science in Bern and many other courses are offered, e.g. NA and leadership specifically for principals or Uri Weinblatts workshop "Regulating shame in families and in schools".

More than 300 people attended for the 18th time the annual conference "Stärke statt Macht" in November 2018 and the next conference is upcoming in November 2019. Last year Haim Omer was joined by Eia Asen, Uri Weinblatt, Roland Reichenbach, Natalie Knapp, Stefan Ofner, Claudia Seefeldt, Hansjürg Lusti and teachers, parents and kids sharing their experiences with New Authority. Experts from different fields could use that opportunity to exchange their knowledge and experiences.

The experts of isi and isi.netz24 are accompanying and consulting many institutions in long-term projects. Relatively new is the development in after-school care institutions starting implementing NA and cooperating more intensely with parents and schools.

The NA network isi-netz24 hosted three open network meetings in 2018 and so far two meetings this year giving opportunities to expand and strengthen the net and add new "knots" to the Swiss community.
